

JAMES G. SAGE

G-11 DIES NEAR GILMAN

James G. Sage passed away at his home six and one half miles southwest of Gilman, Saturday, Dec. 26. Mr. Sage was 70 years, 10 months and 12 days old at death. The cause of his death was paralysis. He had had three light strokes before and on Wednesday morning of the previous week had suffered another stroke while in the yard at his home. He was found by Mrs. Sage who summoned help and he remained in an unconscious state until his death. He is survived by his wife and four children, a half brother, Henry Sage, and his stepmother, Mrs. Elizabeth Sage, both of Dresden, four grandchildren and three foster grandchildren, besides other relatives and a host of friends.

The funeral was held Tuesday, Rev. G. L. Stanley, pastor of the Friends church, Searsboro, in charge. There was prayer service at the home at 10 o'clock, followed by a short funeral service at Union chapel. From there the remains were taken overland to Lynnville where further funeral service was held in the Friends church. Burial followed in Woodland cemetery near Lynnville.
