Man Killed as Car Hits Tree

Darrell L. Salvers, 32, of 702 East St., Grinnell, was killed when the car in which he was riding went out of control at 2 a.m. Thursday morning and crashed into a tree.

The fatality was Poweshiek County's second in three days and the fourth of 1969.

According to Police Chief Bill Peters, the car was being driven by another Grinnell man, Victor Vulysteke Jr., 33, of 422 High St. The car was owned by Salyers.

Peters said Vulysteke apparently lost control of the car at the curve on Sixth Ave. near Grinnell College. The eastbound vehicle skidded onto the grass and hit the three near St. Paul's Episcopal Church.

Salvers was dead on arrival at Grinnell General Hospital West.

steke is reported in satisfactcondition with a fractured arm and bruises.


Darrell Salyers was born March 10, 1937, the son of Roscoe and Leta Salyers. He attended Grinnell schools and later served in the U. S. Army.
