ployed to Johnston Island in a private yacht that had been pressed into service for use by the Navy during the war. His military honors include the Asiatic-Pacific Campaign Ribbon.

In 1945 Richard was honorably dis-

charged from the service and returned to Grinnell where he worked briefly for Burlin Atkins dairy. From 1946 to 1949 he worked for Weitz Construction Com-pany, then started his own construction business. Over the course of his career Richard built many homes in Grinnell. In his later years he specialized in remod-

cling projects, especially older houses. Richard Sanders was a member of the Masonic Lodge, the Royal Arch Masons, and the American Legion. He was a former member of the Rotary Club and the Elks Lodge, as well as serving for a time as a ward committeeman in the Democratic Party of Poweshiek County.
