Saris memorial set for Sept. 21

Edith Knight Saris, a Grinnell native, died Sept. 13 in Wautoma, Wis.

Edith Saris willed her body to the Cancer Research Center at the University of Wisconsin. Memorial services were set for Friday, Sept. 21 in Millar Chapel on the Northwestern University campus in Evan ston, Ill.

Her ashes will be returned to Grinnell for interment at Hazelwood Cemetery at a later date.

Born in Grinnell on December 19, 1905, she was the daughter of Frank E. and Alice Blaisdelle Knight. She attended local schools and graduated from Grinnell College in 1927. After two years teaching in Marion, she was admitted to the medical technicians' training program in the Evanston, Ill., hospital. She worked there on completion of her training.

She also held a similar post with a group of doctors in Chicago.

She left her job to become private secretary to Dr. J. Roscoe Miller, dean of the Northwestern Medical School on the Chicago campus. When Miller became president of the school, she continued as his secretary on the Evanston campus. She retired from the position in 1970, ending roughly 40 years association with that university.

In 1966 she married John Saris of Evanston, and in 1970 they moved to Wautoma to begin their retirement.

She is survived by her husband; a sister, Mrs. Fred (Anna) Ramsey; and her nephew. Rickard K. Ramsey of Grinnell. She was preceded in death by her parents and a vister Ruth Knight Lind.
