for a still greater share of criticism.

The Brooklyn Chronicle speaks as follows of Mrs. John T. Scott who died at Brooklyn on the 24th of Jan.:

Maria Isabel Shimer was born in Berlin, Holmes county, Ohio, July 26, 1842. On Thanksgiving day 1868, she was married to John T. Scott. To them were born two children, a daughter, who died when a little child, and a son, Oliver who with his father is left to mourn her loss.
