Funeral Services Held Today For Adelbert Sears

A. Adelbert Sears, 59, Rtc. 1, Gilman, died late Monday evening at a Grinnell hospital following failing health the last 4 months.

Funeral services were held this afternoon (Thursday) at the Community church (UCC) in Gilman with the pastor, the Rev. Paul Dowty, and the Rev. Thomas Sears of the Methodist church in Onawa, officiating. Vocal music was by Mrs. Keith Stahl, accompanied by Mrs. Richard Coppock at the organ.
