Richard C. "Dick" Seeland, 94, of Grinnell died Wednesday, March 17, at St. Francis Manor.

He also served on the St. Francis Manor Board and the Seeland Park Board. Seeland Park, the St Francis Manor retirement housing complex, was named in his honor.

Surviving are two daughters, Ann Raridon of Newton and Emily State of Kearney, Neb.; five grandchildren; and 11 great-grandchildren.

He was preceded in death by his parents, his wife and one sister, Mary Howes.
