

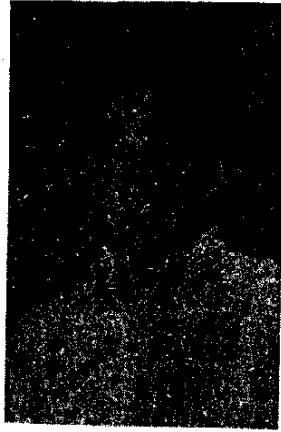
George Selle Services Set

George R. Selle, 80, of the Westfield community died Sunday morning (Jan. 20) at Grinnell General Hospital, where he had been a patient for one week. He had been in failing health in recent months.

The son of Louis F. and Cora Otcheck Selle, he was born southwest of Grinnell on Sept. 19, 1893. He attended the Westfield rural school. On Feb. 24, 1915, he was married to Ada B. Hoover in Grinnell. Mr. Selle had farmed all of his life, and he and his wife had lived on their present farm since 1921.

He is survived by his wife Ada; his children, Raymond Lloyd Selle of Grinnell and Mrs. William (Judith) Vonk of Arlington, Tex.; six grandchildren and six great-grandchildren.
