Jacob Shain, 84, Longtime Area Resident, Dies

After an illness of several months, Jacob Shain, 84, of Rte. 2, Grinnell died early Thursday morning at a local hospital.

Services were conducted Sunday afternoon from the Smith Funeral Home with the Rev. Peter Schuler, pastor of the Lynnville Friends church, officiating. Organ music was provided by Mrs. Kathleen Heffner.

Pallbearers were Dale Brush, Teunis DeRuiter, Cornie Dunsbergen, Lehrl Fritz, Bernard Kooistra, and Myron White. Burial was in Woodland cemetery at Lynnville.

Born in Gludoky, Russia, on July 15, 1878, he came to the United States at the age of 26. He was married to Ada Horn at Newton on August 30, 1922.

Mr. Shain farmed in the Bethel community north of Lynnville for many years and continued to make his home on the family farm after his wife's death in the early 1930's.

He had been a member of the Masonic Lebanon Lodge No. 227, AF & AM, at Lynnville.

SUGAR CREEK - Jake Shain, 86, a longtime resident of the Bethel community near Lynnville, died Thursday at the Community Hospital in Grinnell where he had been a patient for the past eight days.

Funeral services will be held at 1:30 p.m. Sunday at the Smith Funeral Home in Grinnell.

The Rev. Peter Schuler, minister of the Friends Church at Lynnville, will conduct the services. Burial will be in Woodland Cemetery at Lynnville.

He is survived by a sister and at least one brother.

Born at Odessa in Southern Russia in 1876, Mr. Shain came to the United States at the age of 18. He worked for farmers in the Lynnville area for several years.

After his marriage to Ada Horn in 1922, he moved to a farm in the Bethel Community, residing there since that time. He was a resident of the Nelson Manor for a short time in January ^{Newton Daily News}.
