Killed in Crash

A former Malcom man, Bill Shaw, age 32, now of Des Moines, was killed early Wednesday morning when his car went out of control and crashed near Des Moines at the junction of Interstate 80 and Merle Hay Road. He was pronounced dead at Broadlawns Polk County Hospital in Des Moines.

The son of Price L. and Sylvia L. Dykes Shaw, he was born on June 19. 1936, at Malcom. He attended the Malcom schools and also attended the School of Automation at Des Moines.

He served in the U. S. Air Force from 1957 to 1960 and later served with the Navy for two years aboard the aircraft carrier Saratoga.

He worked for the Malcom Farmers Co-op Elevator as an accountant for four years, and for the past six months had been employed by the Dial Finance Co. of Des Moines. He was a member of the Eagles Lodge.

Mr. Shaw is survived by his two sisters, Mrs. James (Sybil) Puls of Malcom and Mrs. Wayne (Mertie) Kinnaird of Brooklyn; his brother, Preston Shaw of Malcom; nieces and nephews—Jimmie, Dale, Gary, Shirley, and Linda Puls and Curtis and Linda Kinnaird; and his grandmother, Mrs. Alta Baring of Malcom. He was preceded in death by his parents.

Funeral services for Mr. Shaw will be held at 2 p.m. Friday at the James - Schalinske Funeral Home, with the Rev. James Davidson, pastor of the Malcom Methodist church, officiating. Interment will be in the Ivy Hill cemetery at Malcom.
