Louisa Belle Gilbert was born in Mahaska county on a farm home near Fremont, August 10, 1865 and departed this life at University Park, Iowa, July 25, 1932 at 2:10 p. m., being 66 years, 11 months and 15 days old. She was the eldest daughter of Joseph W. Gilbert, deceased, of Grinnell.

On September 25, 1890, she was united in marriage to B. F. Sheline at High Point, Iowa. They lived a few years at Garden Grove, Iowa. They moved to Grinnell where she could be near her parents in their declining years, and later to University Park, Iowa, where she lived till the Death Angel claimed her blood washed spirit.

She was converted in a camp meeting in her early teens, and lived a beautiful, sanctified life to the end. Mr. and Mrs. Sheline, on moving to Grinnell united with the Methodist church. Later, when they moved to University Park to make their home, they united with the Nazarene church there, of which church she was a member at the time of her death.

She had a presentiment of her death and told her husband two months before she would not live long and instructed him in regard to all the details in the arrangements of her funeral. She chose the singers, the songs she desired, the text for the sermon, and the minister, even mentioning the smallest items in the service, as well as planning the clothing to be worn at that time.

She truly set her house in order for her home going. For 20 years she felt the call of God on her to distribute tracts. The passion for souls so possessed her that any work that she could do to secure funds to carry on the work of distribution of tracts was cheerfully done and thus she gladly spent and was spent for the glory of God and salvation of souls.

Mrs. Sheline leaves to mourn her passing, beside her husband and daughter, Daisy Hester of Kansas, two grand children, who were at her bedside when she passed into the spirit world, two sisters and four brothers. They are: Mrs. W. E. Schooley and Mrs. H. H. Fleener of Grinnell, A. F. Gilbert of University Park, George F. of Grinnell, Amos H. of Blue Point, and Fred M. Gilbert of Scobey, Montana. Funeral services were conducted from the Nazarene church at 2:30, July 27th and burial at University Park.
