Mrs. Shifflett came to this country with her parents when a child. They lived first in Scott county and when she was about fifteen years old the family came to Poweshiek county, which has been her home ever since. She was married on January 29, 1880, to Albert Franklin Shifflett, Mrs. Shifflett dying on the 48th anniversary of their wedding day. Mr. Shifflett died in 1895, leaving Mrs. Shifflett with the two young sons, whom she has seen grow to successful manhood.
