Military Tribute For Lewis Shook

Members of the American Legion served as a color guard Monday morning at the final memorial to Lewis Shook, a buddy from World War I service. Rev. Frank Jacobs conducted the religious services at 10 a.m. at the Steffy Funeral Home. Louis Gorsuch played the musical selections.

Interment was in Jackson Township cemetery. Casket bearers were Scott Cummings, Carl Butler, Ray Hall, Marvin Calderwood, Alfred Robey and Lyle Hall.

Lewis, youngest son of Peter and Annie Collins Shook, was born in Montezuma, Nov. 11, 1894, and died in the Veterans hospital, Iowa City, Dec. 6, at 69 years of age.

In World War I, he served in the armed forces, being stationed at Waco, Texas, most of the time.

Most of his life was spent in construction work and farm labor on various Poweshiek county farms.

He is survived by a brother, Elijah Shook, Grinnell, and a sister, Viola Albright, Stella, Mo., several nieces and nephews, other relatives and many friends.
