Mrs. Onley Sisco Rites Tuesday

Mrs. Onley Sisco, 76, of 829 Pearl St. in Grinnell, died early Saturday morning at the home of her son Shirley where she had lived the past five years.

Mrs. Sisco was born in Newburg, Iowa, on July 29, 1890, to Frank and Louella Andrews Lewis. She attended the local schools of Newburg.
