Glen A. Slater.

Glen A. Slater was born in Kellogg, Iowa, June 7, 1883, the son of J. F. and Clara A. Slater. During his youth the family moved to Grinnell, Iowa, but Glen is kindly remembered by a number of friends and acquaintances in and about his birth-place. The nature of his occupation, that of brick mason, required him to make frequent changes in location, so that much of his later years has been spent away from home. In the inscrutable wisdom of the Great Master of our destinies, his span of life was suddenly terminated in Omaha, Nebraska, December 7, 1919, he then being six months past his thirty-sixth birthday. Thus in the full flower of manhood, when the star of his career seemed to be at its zenith, he was called to embark upon the Great Adventure. He leaves surviving, besides his bereaved mother and father, one brother, Loyal B., and one sister, Anona, and a number of more distant relatives. These are left to soothe the sorrow of the son and daughter, Lemoyne, aged twelve, and Fay, aged nine.

The funeral service was held in the chapel of the Blizzard Undertaking Parlors at Kellogg, December 10th, Rev. Ashley S. Farnham, minister of the Church of Christ, officiating. Selections by a quartette were impressively rendered, and many tributes of friendship were manifested in the beautiful flowers. — Kellogg Enterprise.
