

## Last Rites Said For Dr. Sloan

Funeral services were held at 2 p.m. Saturday, Oct. 3, at the James-Schalinske Funeral home in Grinnell for Dr. John W. Sloan, 52, a former resident of Grinnell, who died Wednesday, Sept. 30, in a hospital in St. Croix Fall, Wis. He had been living in Newberry, Mich.

The Rev. J. Eugene Young, pastor of the Grinnell United Methodist Church, officiated at the services.

Organist was Kathleen Heffner. Pallbearers were W. W. White, James White, John Sloan, Robert Sloan, Patrick Mead and James Mattson.

Burial was in Hazelwood Cemetery.

The son of Paul and Edna Sloan, Dr. Sloan was born Feb. 28, 1918, at South English, Iowa. He came to Grinnell with his parents at an early age and received his education in the Grinnell schools graduating from Grinnell high school. In 1939, Dr. Sloan graduated from Grinnell College and continued his education at the University of Chicago Medical School. He served his internship and five-years residency in surgery at the Chicago school. He practiced medicine in Fort Arthur, Tex.; Nashville, N. Car., and Newberry, Mich.

During World War II he served with the medical corp of the U.S. Army for three years. Dr. Sloan was a member of the Elks Lodge, the Veterans of Foreign Wars and the Southern Medical Association. He was a fellow in the American College of Surgeons.

On March 13, 1961, Dr. Sloan married Patricia Jean Ellison in Texas.

Survivors include his wife; one daughter, Mrs. James (Ann) Mattson of Marquette, Mich.; two sons — Joseph Robert, serving with the U. S. Marine Corp. and John Walter of Chicago; one granddaughter; and his mother, Mrs. Edna Sloan of McAllen, Texas.

Dr. Sloan was preceded in death by his father.
