**Alfred Smith
Services Held
At Fairfield**

Alfred Smith died suddenly at his home in Fairfield, May 14, and funeral services were held May 17, at Saint Mary's church in Fairfield.

Alfred was born Aug. 26, 1904, one of 11 children, in the Harry R. Smith family, on the family farm south of Montezuma. He was graduated from high school at Barnes City. He worked with the police force at Oskaloosa until his marriage, when he moved to Fairfield and was a communications man with the Iowa Highway Patrol. He later worked with Loudon Mfg. Co. at Fairfield.

Alfred is survived by his wife Ethel, and five children; also ten brothers and sisters, eight of whom attended the services and spent the week end at the home of a sister, Mrs. Elizabeth Westercamp, at Deep River.
