

## George A. Schrader

6-11 Dies Saturday

5-2-1930

George Albert Schrader was born November 1, 1869, in Lincoln town, near Guernsey. He grew to manhood in the vicinity of Deep River and Guernsey. On January 1, 1893, he was married in marriage with Lizzie Steller. Six children were born to this union, three sons and two daughters. Ethel Marie and Alva George died in infancy.

In 1896, after being instructed in the Lutheran faith, he was confirmed by Rev. Otto Kitzmann. A number of years later, after moving to Deep River, he united with the Methodist Episcopal church.

About ten years ago his leg was broken in an accident, and since then it has never been well. The last year

he failed rapidly and Saturday, April 19, was forced to take to his bed. He lay unconscious for a week except for a brief time Tuesday. Early Saturday morning, April 26, he fell asleep in Jesus. He was 60 years, 5 months and 25 days old.

He leaves to mourn his loss, his wife and two children, Wm. of Deep River; Ethel, Mrs. Walter Stoker, of Brooklyn; his father of Audubon; a sister, Mrs. Fred Tessman of Ross; and one granddaughter, besides many other relatives and friends.

He was laid to rest in the Golden Rod cemetery Sunday, April 27, with the Rev. Lloyd Tennant officiating and the Rev. E. L. Patterson officiating.
