Obituary of Carl Schultz

Carl Schultz was born May 8, 1827, in the Kingdom of Prussia, Germany. He served two years as a soldier in the Prussian Army, from Oct. 1, 1849, to Oct. 1, 1851, 2nd Infantry, 3rd Company.

He came to the United States in the spring of 1854, locating in Bureau County, Ill.

On the 17th day of August, 1859, he married Mrs. Mina Meuller, and in the spring of 1862 he moved with his family to Iowa, locating in Madison township, Poweshiek County.

In the spring of 1891, he moved to Malcom, Iowa, where he resided until his demise.

His companion passed over the river of death Nov. 5, 1899. On the 23rd day of December, 1901, he was married to Mrs. Augusta Vick. He was baptised in his infancy according to the usages of the Lutheran church and was confirmed April 24, 1845, and continued a consistent member of the church until he was called to the Church Triumphant around God's throne in heaven Feb. 22, 1911, aged 83 years, 9 months and 14 days. Having no children of his own to call him father, he became a father to 6 fatherless children whom he reared to manhood and womanhood; viz, Mrs. C. H. Schultz and her two brothers, Will and Fred Platt, stepchildren; John and Joe McMurray and Lizzie Cain (now Mrs. Andreas Errickson). He leaves a wife, many relatives and many friends to mourn his loss. "Uncle Charley Schultz," as we were wont to call him, was a good man and was loved and esteemed by all who knew him. The funeral services were held in the M. E. church in Malcom, Saturday, Feb. 25, 1911, at 1 p. m., Rev. Crull conducting the services in the presence of a very large congregation; after which the I. O. O. F. Lodge took charge and he was laid to rest by them in the Ivy Hill Cemetery.
