Mass held for Mr. Schultz

A Funeral Mass was held at 1:30 p.m. Tuesday at St. Patrick's Catholic Church in Brooklyn for Marvin Schultz, 61, of Rte. 1, Brooklyn, who died Friday evening at Grinnell General Hospital. June 5

The Rev. Fr. Karl Holtkamp, pastor of St. Patrick's was the celebrant. A Rosary service was conducted at 7:30 p.m. Monday at the Nevenhoven Funeral Home in Brooklyn. Burial was at the Calvary Cemetery, with military rites

conducted by members of the Francis Gallagher American Legion Post No. 294.

The son of William C. Schultz and Bessie Louks Schultz, he was born Sept 20, 1919, in Pharr, Texas. He moved to Iowa when he was 12 years old and graduated from Ferguson High School in 1938. He enlisted in the U.S. Marine Corps on Jan. 26, 1942, and served until November 1945.

On Dec. 3, 1945, he was married to Ann Marie O'Laughlin in Crafton, Pa. He farmed at Gilman from 1946 to 1968 and at Brooklyn since 1968. Mr. Schultz was a member of St. Patrick's Catholic Church and the American Legion.

Survivors include his wife, Ann; two sons, James David Schultz of Kingman, Ariz., and Richard Joseph Schultz of Canton, Texas; three daughters, Bessie Ann Griffith of Brooklyn, Catherine Marie Schultz of Brooklyn and Linda Lee Schultz of Malcom; a brother, Elmer Schultz of San Benito, Texas; five sisters, Grace Serviere of McAllen, Texas, Alice Peterson of Elma, Irene Weave of State Center, Inez Alexander of Elizabeth City, N.C., and Clara Alexander of Marshalltown; and eight grandchildren.
