Miss Sarah H. Snell, a member of a family prominently identified with the early days of Grinnell College, died at her home in Berkeley, California, on January 28. The family originally came from New Sharon. The one hrother, Richard B. Snell, now of Crescent City, California, graduated from the college in the class of 1870, and two of her three sisters are also graduated here: Mrs. Edna Snell Poulson in 1867 and Miss Mary E. Snell in 1869. The other sister, Margaret, attended college here but did not graduate. Miss Sarah Snell, herself, did not attend the college. Miss Snell came to Berkeley in 1880, four years after the founding of the Snell school by her sister, Miss Mary Snell, and devoted the remainder of her life to building up the institution, now one of the best known on the coast. She was matron of the school. After the death of Miss Mary Snell, Mrs. Poulson took charge of the school and now conducts it.

Miss Sarah Snell was 72 years of age. She was stricken whith paralysis last July and had been gradually failing since that time.
