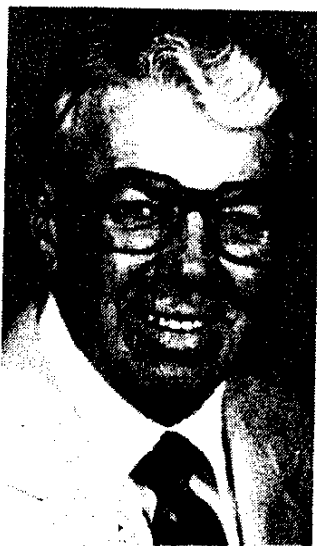

## Dale Snook rites Friday

Dale W. "Bud" Snook, 62, of 1934 Spencer St., Grinnell, a longtime local businessman, died of cancer Monday, July 25, at Grinnell General Hospital.

Funeral services will be conducted at 1:30 p.m. Friday at the Smith Funeral Home, with the Rev. Raymond C. Lott, pastor of the Grinnell United Methodist Church, and the Rev. John E. Graham, retired pastor of St. Michael's Catholic Church in Belle Plaine, officiating. Organist will be Kathleen Heffner, and vocalist will be Sherry Shults.

Pallbearers will be Charles Bethel, Ronald Emerson, Mark Knopf, Fred Nelson, Larry Nelson, Randall Reavis and James Webb. Burial will be in Union Cemetery, Newton.

Memorials in Mr. Snook's name may be made to the American Cancer Society and left at the funeral home.

He was the son of Robert I. and Susan E. Smith Snook and was born Jan. 6, 1926, in Newton. He attended Newton schools, graduating from Newton High School in 1943.

During World War II he served with the U.S. Army Air Corps. He was married to Dorothy J. Adams April 6, 1947, in Newton.

For 18 years Mr. Snook served as manager of Denniston & Partridge Lumber stores in Mingo, Bloomfield and Grinnell. He was credited with building numerous homes in Grinnell and with the development and naming of Belmont Park subdivision here.

He was also the co-developer of Grinnell's first home show. He was a member of the Grinnell Chamber of Commerce, the Grinnell Elks Lodge and the Rotary club. Mr. Snook sold component homes and apartments throughout Iowa. Since 1983 he had owned Snook Lumber Products of Newton, a supplier to the Maytag Co.

He is survived by his wife, Dorothy, and a son, Robert M. Snook of Dallas, Texas. He was preceded in death by his parents.
