George Sinclair Snyder, a former minister in Montezuma, died Dec. 17, 1999 at his home in Rogers, Ark.

A memorial service at Central Methodist Church in Rogers was Dec. 22. Rev. Snyder is to be <u>buried in Montezuma</u>, where he was the Methodist minister in the late 50s and early 60s.

He was born Aug. 7, 1914 in Mt, Vernon to the Rev. Jacob J. and Merle Ruth Cowie Snyder. He was a graduate of Cornell College in Mount Vernon and the Boston University School of Theology. In 1942, he married Dorothy Dale in Massachusetts. She died in 1983. He then married Ruth Wells in 1984.

Surviving are his wife, Ruth of Rogers, one son and daughter-in-law, George D. and Mary Ann Snyder; one grandson, Stephen S. Snyder, all of lowa City and one sister, Theresa Foster of Ottumwa. He is also survived by one step-son, two step-daughters, one step-son-in-law, four step-grandchildren and two step-greatgrandchildren.
