—Mrs. Marian J. Spaulding, wife of H. W. Spaulding, died Sunday, Feb. 19, about noon. While Mrs. Spaulding has not been well since the death of her son Harry, a little more than a year ago, the end came so suddenly at last as to be a surprise to many of her most intimate friends. She spent most of the summer and fall in Colorado hoping to improve her health, but in vain. Since her return she was thought to be getting a little better. She seemed to pass away from general debility. Only Friday she was taken worse, but she still wanted to be up and dressed, but she fainted in the attempt. Mrs. Spaulding was born in Hartland, Vt., in 1853, and was consequently about 35 years of age. She was a graduate of the Windsor, Vt., high school, and was soon after married to Mr. H. W. Spaulding. They remained in Vermont between three and four years and then came west, locating in this place where they have resided ever since. Mrs. Spaulding was never strong, but she was a faithful wife and a good mother, and much beloved, especially by her intimate friends. She leaves her husband and two boys, who have the sympathy of a large circle of friends in their sore bereavement. The funeral occurs this afternoon with a brief service at the house at 2 o'clock, and then at the church at half past two.
