## BODY OF PIONEER IS

6-11 BROUGHT FOR BURIAL

Mrs. Florence E. Stahl Borne to Last Resting Place by Hands of Old Friends.

The body of Mrs. Florence E. Stahl, one of the well known residents of Grinnell many years ago, was brought to this city for burial on Wednesday morning. Mrs. Stahl died in Chicago on Monday morning, aged sixty-five years. The body was accompanied to Grinnell by her youngest son, Haller, an employe of the Herald office in the early days, with whom she had been making her home in Chicago. Old friends were present in the depot, and after an opportunity had been given in the Kibby & Benson undertaking rooms to look their last upon a loved face, they escorted the body to Hazelwood cemetery, where interment was made.

Mrs. Stahl was the wife of John Stahl well remembered here as an old soldier and pioneer business man. Mr. Stahl died eighteen years ago and eight or nine years ago Mrs. Stahl went to Chicago to make her home. She is well remembered here, however, by the old settlers, and her death is sincerely mourned.

Three children survive: Edgar W., of Portland, Oregon; and J. Haller and Nora Alice, both of Chicago.

The pall bearers, chosen from among the old soldiers, were H. I. Davis, Le-Roy Forehand, A. B. Stowe, E. Shadbolt, John Campbell and H. A. Field.
