Keith D. Stahl, 39, of Malcom died Monday morning at Grinnell General Hospital of multiple sclerosis.

The son of Henry E. and Esther Fry Stahl, he was born Oct. 7, 1933, in Grinnell. He attended rural schools and Gilman Elementary School when he and his family lived near Newburg and Gilman. In 1952, he was graduated from Montezuma High School when his family moved to farm in the Ewart and Montezuma area. Following high school he was employed as an operating engineer doing farm conservation work. He also worked on building the Ohio Turnpike.

He was married to Marilyn Ann Hubbard Feb. 12, 1956, in Montezuma. A few days after his marriage, he learned of his illness; since that time, he gradually failed in health. In August of 1958, Mr. and Mrs. Stahl moved to Malcom to make their home. Mrs. Stahl is associated with the Grinnell State Bank's Malcom office.

Mr. Stahl is survived by his wife, Marilyn; his daughter Jodie, 15; his mother, Mr. Esther Stahl of Malcom; two brothers, S-Sgt. Norman I Stahl of the U. S. Air Force stationed at Travis AFB Calif., and Lyle E. Stahl.
