He was a charter member of the Guthrie Theater. While in Kansas City he was an artist in residence at U.M.K.C. where he was an actor and director in many Missouri Repertory Productions. Mr. Stanley was the Artistic Director of the first full equity company of the Resident Theater in Kansas City,

After living and working in New York, Alvah and his wife have made their home in Los Angeles for the last sixteen years. There he continued his theatrical career directing and acting in stage, television, and film productions. He also had a successful antique business, and participated in the development of several screen plays.

Most recently Alvah played the title role in the Euro-Disney production of Buffalo Bill's Wild West Show in Paris, France. Upon returning from France he and his sister Sara established SAVElectronics of Denver, Colo., and he was currently in preproduction for two films.

He was preceded in death by his father Alvah Willard Stanley, Sr.
