Charles Louis Stanley

Charles Louis Stanley, son of John Henry and Cornelia Stanley, was born in Poweshiek county, November 21, 1860 and passed away at the Woods Nursing Home July 13, 1954 at the age of 93 years, 7 months and 22 days.

On Feb. 3, 1884, he was united in marriage with Clara Belle Faulkner. To this union were born two sons, who died in infancy, and one daughter, Mrs. S. L. Downey of Grinnell. Besides the daughter he is survived by two sisters, Mrs. Emma Miller of New Sharon and Mrs. Ella Gordon of Oskaloosa, two grand children, Mildred Downey of Chicago and Keith Downey of Grinnell and six great grandchildren. One brother, Robert, and two sisters, Mrs. Mary Stillwell and Mrs. Minnie Main preceded him in death. After the death of his wife, July 16, 1941, he made his home with his daughter.

Mr. and Mrs. Stanley united with the Friends Church at Searsboro. During the early years of his life he was active in church and civic affairs. In 1908 he moved to the farm east of Grinnell and continued to live there until 1914 when he retired and moved to town.

Although he retained his membership in the Friends church, he attended the Methodist church and Sunday school.

On May 11 of last year he suffered a broken hip and was hospitalized and in a nursing home until his death.

He led a quiet and wholesome life devoted to his family and friends.

Funeral services were held on Friday, July 16, 1954 at two o'clock at the James funeral home with Rev. John DeLong in charge.

Mrs. Dolph Miller provided the music with Mrs. Roscoe Dempster as pianist.

Pallbearers were Paul Vogt, Glen Vogt, Lester Baustian, Earl Fowler, Shirley Eichhorn, and Ross Mintle.

Interment was in Hazelwood Cemetery.
