Rev. Ernest Starr Succumbs: Rites Held Saturday

The Rey. Ernest J. Starr, 84, resident of the Mayflower Home this past year, died early Thursday morning at a local hospital following an illness of two weeks.

Funeral services were held Saturday afternoon from the Grinnell Methodist church with the Rev. Chester Custer, pastor, and the Rev. R. O. Grote, minister of the Conrad Methodist church, officiating. Organ music was provided by Elbert Smith.

He attended the schools near his home and graduated from Grinnell high school. Rev. Starr attended Iowa Wesleyan College at Mt. Pleasant for several years prior to his marriage to <u>Gertrude</u> E. <u>Bump.</u> on Nov. 4, <u>1903</u>, in Grinnell.

Starr of Takoma Park, Md.
Mrs. Starr preceded him in
death on April 8, 1929. He was married to Miss Flora Walker on Sept. 30, 1931, at Brooklyn. She preceded him in death on May 28, 1963.

Rev. Starr began his 60 years in the Methodist ministry at Ewart, near Grinnell, and then served as boys director of the YMCA at Mt. Pleasant and Waterloo. During that time he continued his college education and received his B.A. and B.Th. degrees at Du-

buque University.

He had held some 10 different pastorates in northeast Iowa, serving the North Iowa District of the Methodist church. Following his retirement. Rev.
