

## Mrs. Steenhoeck Dies Thursday; Rites Are Held

Mrs. Cornelia Steenhoeck, resident of Grinnell for 34 years, died Thursday night, Oct. 28, following a short illness. She was 82 years old.

Mrs. Steenhoeck had been in failing health for the past two years but had remained active until just a few days before her death.

Funeral services were held this afternoon, Monday, at Smith Funeral Home with Rev. C. E. Kingsley, pastor of the First Baptist church officiating.

Daughter of Isaac and Anna DeJong Dunnick, she was born October 17, 1872 in Jasper county near Sully. She had lived in the Sully community until coming to Grinnell 34 years ago.

On Oct. 21, 1891, she was married to Cornelius Steenhoeck, who died in 1925.

Surviving are two sons, Will and Roy, both of Grinnell; two grandchildren and five great-grandchildren. Also surviving is a brother, Carl Dunnick of Lynnville; and three sisters, Mrs. John Baarda of Monroe; Mrs. Emma Miller of Sully and Mrs. Harold Lamphier of Kilduff; several nieces and nephews.
