

## Menvil Stepp

Menvil Stepp, 86, of Kellogg died of respiratory arrest Saturday, Jan. 13, at the Iowa Veterans Home in Marshalltown.

Funeral services were conducted Tuesday at the Reese Chapel in Newton, with the Rev. Morris Hurd, pastor of the Kellogg United Methodist Church, officiating. Burial was in Our Silent City Cemetery in Kellogg.

He was the son of Otto and Mollie Delk Stepp and was born Jan. 29, 1914, in Monticello, Ky. He moved to Kellogg in 1926 and was educated in Kellogg-area schools. He served with the U.S. Army during World War II.

He was married to Wanetta Hill June 6, 1945, in Kellogg.

Mr. Stepp was a member of the American Legion and Emerson Hough Chapter of the Izaak Walton League. He had been a resident of the Iowa Veterans Home since 1983.

Surviving are his wife, now a resident of St. Francis Manor; one brother, Floyd of Kellogg; and two sisters, Flonnie Matherly of Grinnell and Maggie Foster of Kellogg.

He was preceded in death by his parents; two infant daughters, Ida Joette and Martha Jane, and two sisters, Della Stepp and Pearl Clifton.
