Delmar F. Stewart, 91, of Grinnell died Wednesday, April 14, 1999 at St. Francis Manor in Grinnell.

Mr. Stewart's funeral was April 16 at Grinnell United Methodist Church. The Rev. Del Dawes officiated.

He married Mae Larsen in Grinnell on July 20, 1930.

They farmed in the Blue Point

neighborhood for 31 years before moving to Grinnell in 1966. There, Mr. Stewart worked for DeKalb Seed Corn Company in sales and later, for the former James-Schalinske Funeral Home.

He was a member of Grinnell United Methodist Church and Grinnell Elks Lodge No. 1266. He also was an active member of Herman Masonic Lodge in Grinnell and Kaaba Shrine in Davenport.

Preceding him in death were his parents, his wife, Mae, who died Aug. 7, 1991 and a brother, Virgil, who died in infancy.
