Mrs. D. S. Stewart, 76, well known and beloved Grinnell lady passed away at her home 717 5th avenue Saturday evening at 7 o'clock. The funeral services will be held Tuesday afternoon at 1:30 o'clock from the home with Rev. E. M. Vittum in charge. Interment will be at the family lot in Hazelwood.
