Former Minister Dies In Washington

A former Grinnell minister in the Presbyterian church has died in Washington, Iowa. He is Walter Jamison Stewart who was minister here prior to his retirement in 1957.

The Rev. Mr. Stewart was born in Turtle Creek, Pa., April 28, 1875. He was educated in the Pennsylvania schools and attended the Pittsburgh Seminary, where he graduated in 1902. He was a Doctor of Divinity from Tarkio College.

He was married in 1902 to Nettie Edith Thompson who preceded him in death in 1961. They had five children. He is survived by a brother A. I. Stewart of Harmony, Pa., two sons, Sloan of Columbus, Ohio, and Linn of Colorado Springs, Colo.; one daughter Margaret of Iowa City; and five grandchildren and four great-grandchildren.

He was a member of the Masonic and York Rite Bodies, Kiwanis and Y's Men. He was chairman of the Winterset Red Cross in World War I, and was a member of the social welfare board.
