## A. E. STICKLE DIES IN AUTO ACCIDENT

Former Resident of Grinnell Passes
Away Friday at Noon, Following
Accident.

DRIVES OFF BOAD WHEN
CAR ATTEMPTS TO PASS.

Funeral Was Held Monday Afternoon From Highland Park Presbyterian Church.

Emery Stickle, a former resident of Grinnell but for a number of years of Des Moines, died on the way to an Ames hospital, after being pinned beneath a wrecked auto at noon Friday. The car turned over three miles south of Ames.

He and his family were driving north to a picnic, when a car driven by E. R. Graham, of Des Moines, attempted to go by him and in swinging out to let Graham pass Stickle drove off the road, according to Ames police.

The car turned completely over and lay upside down pinning the occupants beneath. Graham released the family and started to rush Stickle to the Ames hospital but the injured man died on the way. Mrs. Stickle, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Jacob Korns of this city, badly bruised was taken to a Des Moines Hospital where she is making a good recovery. Her son, Harry, suffered a broken collar bone, and the other son, Otto, was thrown clear when the car turned over, and was only slightly injured. Following the wreck the family immediately returned to Des Moines.

Mr. Stickle was defeated as a candidate for Republican nomination for State Representatives at the Primaries in June. He was sales manager of the Iowa Printing and Supply Company of Des Moines. At one time he was secretary of the Grinnell Commercial Club.
