Newton Man Dies # R In Hwy. 6 Crash 4/1/73

A Newton man was killed early Saturday morning when the car he was driving went out of control on U.S. Highway 6 five miles west of Grinnell.

Pronounced dead on arrival at Grinnell General Hospital was Michael Still, 31, of 1014
South Second W., Newton.

According to Jasper County Sheriff's Department officials, Still's 1972 Mercury was going west on Highway 6, went out of

control on a curve, hit the right shoulder of the highway, then skidded across the highway into the south ditch. Investigating officers said the car went some 300 feet, rolling over at least three times.

Still was thrown from the vehicle approximately 15 feet. He suffered multiple internal injuries.

The fatal mishap occurred at 12:45 a.m.
