John A. Stilwell 6-14 Answers Call

John A. Stilwell, eldest son of W. E. and Margaret Stilwell, was born in Sugar Creek township, Poweshiek County, Iowa, Dec. 3rd, 1867, and departed this life April 16th. 1928, at his home near Searsboro. He was taken ill suddenly, while at work, and in a few minutes' time, unexpectedly passed away into the great realm from which no traveler returns, aged sixty years, four months and thirteen days.
