Lodema E. Story, 58, of Rte. 1, Tama, died Tuesday noon, Dec. 1, at Grinnell General Hospital, following an illness of the past two years.

The daughter of Isaac and Nora Couch Griffin, she was born on Jan. 26, 1912, near Newburg. She started her education at the Rock Creek school and completed it at the Malcom public schools.

On Aug. 3, 1935, she was married to Vaughn E. Story at the Methodist parsonage in Malcom. Following their marriage, the couple farmed in the Malcom community. In 1936, they moved to Grinnell, where Mrs. Story was employed at the shoe factory. They moved to Belle Plaine in 1943, and in 1948 they moved to Tama. She was employed at the hutton factory at Toledo.

Mrs. Story was a member of the Rebekah Lodge of Tama.
