Gerald Tilman Strand, 52, of
El Cajon, Calif., died suddently
Monday, Sept. 3, of an apparent heart attack. Mr. Strand had arrived from California a few hours earlier and was at the home of his brother, Virgil Strand of Newburg, when he was stricken.
