

## Miss Streck Dies At Local Hospital

Miss Daphne Streck, 74, of 1027 Broad St., died Wednesday evening at Grinnell General Hospital East following an illness of the past two months.

The daughter of Phillip and Rose Anna McCullough Streck, Miss Streck was born in Grinnell on April 17, 1895. She attended Grinnell High School and graduated with a bookkeeping degree from Capital City Commercial College in Des Moines.
