

O.B. Stuart services held

O.B. Stuart, 84, of 1426 Fifth Ave., Grinnell, died Sunday morning at his home.

Funeral services were conducted at 10:30 a.m. Wednesday at the Smith Funeral Home, with the Rev. James P. Russell of the Grinnell United Methodist Church officiating. Organist was Kathleen Heffner.

In the early 1950s, Mr. and Mrs. Stuart moved to the Blue Point community southeast of Grinnell, where they farmed. They retired in 1973 and moved to Grinnell. Mr. Stuart was a member of the Grinnell United Methodist Church.

Survivors include his wife, Bessie; his sons, Keith Stuart of Kellogg and Carroll Stuart of Grinnell; five grandchildren; eight great-grandchildren; and five sisters, Alma Thompson and Eva Balmer, both of Newton, Helen Brubaker of Searsboro, Faye Vogt of Grinnell and Esther Adams of Loveland, Colo.
