George M. Swain passed away Wednesday noon at his home on Eighth and Ann following a paralytic stroke. Funeral services are being conducted this afternoon from his late home in charge of Rev. W. J. Todd assisted by Rev. Mr. Wissler of Chester. Burial will be in Chester Center.
