Frank Talbott, Good Lawyer, Answers Call H.P. 1-22-33 Veteran Attorney Died Early Tuesday At His

Home In Brooklyn

Death came early Tuesday morning to one of the ablest and most highly respected members of the Poweshiek county bar, when Frank R. Talbott, 72, Brooklyn attorney 49 years, passed away at his home there.

Mr. Talbott had been in poor health for a number of years and although able to carry on his practice had been forced to curtail the outside activities in which he had been so prominent in his early life.

Ho will be remembered as a friendly man, a good lawyer, a wise counsellor and a worthy citizen.

OBITUARY

Frank R. Talbott was born in Brooklyn, July 13, 1880, the eldest son of John F. and Nellie Talbott. He attended schools in Brooklyn and Omaha, Neb. IIe studied law in his father's law office in Brooklyn and passed the Iowa bar examinations in 1904. Mr. Talbott practiced law in Brooklyn in partnership with first his father, Judge John F. Talbott and later with his brother John E. Talbott, until shortly before his death.

Very Active

During his very active life in Brooklyn Mr. Talbott served as city attorney and clerk, member of the school board and as County Attorney. He was secretary of the Poweshiek County Bar association for many years. Mr. Talbott had an extensive law practice in the Federal and State courts and was always held in very high esteem by all his fellow attorneys.

He was an active member of the Episcopal church until the Episcopal services in Brooklyn were discontinued.

Mr. Talbott was a member of the I. O. O. F. Lodge and the Knights of Pythias. On several occasions he was chairman of the Poweshiek county Republican organization.
