After a long illness, Mrs. John F. Talbott, wife of Judge J. F. Talbott, passed away Sunday morning. Mrs. Talbott has been closely associated with Brooklyn's history for many years past and is widely known. Her marriage to Judge Talbott was the first wedding ceremony solemnized in the Brooklyn Episcopal church. The funeral services were held in the Episcopal church Wednesday, many people from out of town joining the many Brooklyn friends in paying the last loving tribute to the deceased.
