

Clark Tarvin buried ^{Montezuma Republican 1978}

Services for Clark Phillip Tarvin, 64, of Brooklyn, were held Sunday afternoon, Dec. 24, at the Nevenhoven Funeral Home. Mr. Tarvin died at his home Thursday morning, Dec. 21.

Dr. L.P. Fitzpatrick, pastor of the Malcom-Sheridan Parish, officiated at the rites. Mrs. Ed Bartachek was the organist. Flower attendants were Mr. and Mrs. Pat Vercande. Casket bearers were Stan Altemeier, Donald Brannian, Clifford Beyer, Daryl Dyer, Richard Mowrey and Gail Latcham. Flag presentation was conducted by the Francis Gallagher American Legion Post 294. Burial was in the Ewart Cemetery.

The son of Roy and Una Turney Tarvin, he was born

Jan. 6, 1914, at Barnes City. On Sept. 29, 1937, he was married to Loa Sanders at Lancaster, Mo. They moved to Brooklyn from Montezuma in 1958.

Mr. Tarvin served 14 years in the Navy and three years in the Navy Reserve. For the past several years he was employed by the Brooklyn Motor Co. Prior to that he had operated restaurants at Montezuma and Brooklyn and a Gambles store at Brooklyn. He had worked at Dickey's Prairie Home and the Malzuma Inn near Malcom, the Star Inn and the county secondary roads department. He was a member of the American Legion and a former member of the Knights of Pythias.

He is survived by his wife, Loa; a daughter, Mrs. Larry (Shirley) Hayes of Ankeny; two sons, Jerry of Scottsdale, Ariz., and Clark Jr. of Springfield, Ohio; three brothers, Cleo of Leonia, N.J., Raymond of Malcom and Floyd of Montezuma; two sisters, Mrs. Bertha Vandeburgh of Poughkeepsie, N.Y., and Mrs. Floyd (Marjorie) Little of Montezuma; and five grandchildren.
