RIDGEWOOD - Everett R. Tarvin of Largo, Fla., a former village and Ho-Ho-Kus resident, died Thursday at lus home. He was 71 years old.

A native of Malcolm, Iowa, he lived in the village and Ho 'Ho-Kus 29 years and then in Cincinnati, Ohio, and Leonia, before moving to Florida six months ago. He was an engineer in the operations and engineering department of American Telephone and Telegraph Company's Longlines Division for 44 years before his retirement in 1971.

Survivors include three sons. Roy of the village, Jim of Washingtonville, N.Y. and Charles of Hackensack; a daughter, Mrs. Sally Guinessey of Pittsburgh, Pa.; four brothers, Col. C.E. Tarvin of Leonia, Raymend, Floyd and Clark, all of Iowa; two sisters, Mrs. Bertha Vandenberg of Poughkeepsie, N.Y., and Mrs. Marjorie Little of Iowa, and 14 grandchildren.

A memorial service will be conducted today at 1 p.m. at Christ Episcopal Church. interment will be in Chester Township Cemetery, Grinnell, Iowa.
