Elmer E. Taylor Called By Death

Elmer E. Taylor passed away at 4 o'clock Monday morning after a long illness in which he endured much pain with patience and resignation. He had been sick for over a year. He was 70 years old last August.

Funcral services will be held Wednesday afternoon at 3 o'clock from the home, 1332 Chatterton street, conducted by Rev. C. W. Fowler.

Mr. Taylor was born August 4, 1862, at Chariton, Iowa, the youngest son of Mr. and Mrs. A. B. Taylor. When he was a child the famiy moved to a farm near Lynnville. where he grew to manhood, and where he lived for some time after his marriage to Katherine M. Hunt, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Eden Hunt of Lynnville. In 1901 the family moved to a farm which Mr. Taylor bought five miles east of Newton and lived there until they moved to Grinnell in 1905 to give their children the advantages of a college education. The family home has been here since that time.

Mr. Taylor is survived by his devoted wife and three children, Claude of Altoona, and Osie and Melissa at home; also by one grand child, Eden Boyd Taylor, two brothers, George E. of Lynnville and J. E. of Portland, Oregon, and two sisters, Mrs. Mary Faulkner of New Sharon and Mrs. Della L. Rogers of Portland, Oregon. Mrs. Cogers drove to Grinnell, arriving two weeks ago with her daughter, Avis, and was with her brother during his last days.

Mr. Taylor was a faithful member of the Methodist church and also of the I. O. O. F. lodge. He was a man who loved his home, his family and his friends. He was respected and esteemed by all who knew him for his worth and quiet friendliness and he is sincerely mourned by a large circle of good friends.
