Arie R. Terpstra was born June 19, 1887 in the Netherlands, and died on Nov. 1st, 1960 in his home in Lynnvile, Iowa, at the age of 73 years, four months and 12 days.

He was born the youngest son of George and Renscke Terpstra. He came to the United States of America in February of 1908 and settled near Lynnvile where he married Geetie VanVaals in 1913. She preceded

him in death in August of 1918.

To this union two children were born, Jantze who died in infancy, and George of Newton.
