

## Everett Tew, 67, Dies Suddenly; Services Friday 1966

Everett Tew, 67, of 514 Main Street, died suddenly Tuesday morning at his home.

Funeral services will be held at 2 p.m. Friday from the Smith Funeral Home with the Rev. Wayne Shireman, pastor of the First Baptist church, officiating. Vocal music will be by Mrs. LaForest Sherman and Mrs. Donovan Evans, accompanied by Mrs. R. J. Nash at the organ.

Pallbearers will be Clarence Foster, Marvel DeJong, Fred Schrader, Harold Brown, Hillard Turner, and Harry Crowder. Interment will be in Hazelwood cemetery.

He was the son of Warren and Ira Owens Tew and was born Oct. 18th, 1898, in Grinnell. He attended the local schools and had lived here all of his life with the exception of a few years in Oregon and Minnesota.

On Feb. 11th, 1920, at Marengo, he was united in marriage with Florence Evans of Grinnell. To this union were born one son and two daughters, Clayton Tew of Grinnell, Mrs. Clarence (Frances) Johnson of Albuquerque, N.M., and Mrs. Gerald (Charlotte) Press of Yuma, Ariz.

last year. He had worked for 38 years with the Beatrice Creamery Co. in Grinnell and for many of those years drove the ice delivery truck route.
