## Mr. Thomas rites Tuesday 1980

Charles M. Thomas, 84, of rural Malcom died Saturday, July 12, at Grinnell General Hospital.

Funeral services will be conducted at 10:30 a.m. Tuesday at the Smith Funeral Home, with the Rev. Lawrence P. Fitzpatrick of the Malcom United Methodist Church officiating. The son of Charles Frank and Rosetta Seeway Thomas, he was born March 12, 1896, near Rock Island, Ill. He moved with his family to the Grinnell area and attended Grinnell High School.

On March 12, 1917, he was married to Flonnie Thompson in Newton. The couple farmed in the Bethel area in Rock Creek Township, Jasper County. Mr. Thomas operated a threshing run in the Rock

Creek and Sheridan communities. Following harvest seasons, he operated a saw mill and sorghum mill. He and his wife had lived south of Malcom for 337 years. Mr. Thomas was also an independent trucker and ran a grain and livestock operation.
